## *History of the aqueduct*

It is one of the 9 best conserved aqueducts in Spain and the best conserved in Andalusia.

During the 1st and 2nd centuries BC, Almuñecar lived a golden age in which it earned a lot of gold, which was used for numerous constructions, including the Almuñecar aqueduct, which has more than 1 km.

After this introduction we will focus on the Torrecuevas aqueduct, section 1. This is 130 m long and has 17 light arches and 2 shadow arches. It was found during an excavation between the 70s and 80s.
